


## THE WRITING

An idea can be shared with your lawmakers who will then take it to the "Office of the Revisor of Statutes". They will work to put it into proper form. There will typically be two identical bills- one in the house and one in the senate- called companion bills. To become law, a bill has to pass in BOTH bodies.



## THE COMMITTEES


The bill is introduced and assigned a committee based on subject matter. For instance, a bill about homeschooling would be in an education committee. When the chair of the committee decides to call the bil for discussion, the public can often testify on how it will impact them. Then the committee recommends what action to take to the full house or senate.



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## THE FLOOR


The full house and senate may then call the bill during a floor session. There, they will debate & amend the bills if they think it needs clarifying. If the full house & senate vote to pass the *same* version of a bill, it goes to the governor who will either sign it into law or veto it. The legislature can overturn any veto with a 2/3 vote.



## THE CONFERENCE

If the House and Senate versions of the bill are different (because amendments were made), they then have to go to a conference committee to reach a compromise. If both bodies pass the compromise bill, it goes to the governor who will either sign it into law or veto it. The legislature can overturn any veto with a 2/3 vote.

Not all bills get discussed or passed. Some good ideas can take years of sharing your reasons to earn enough support. The best advocacy is in building these relationships.
