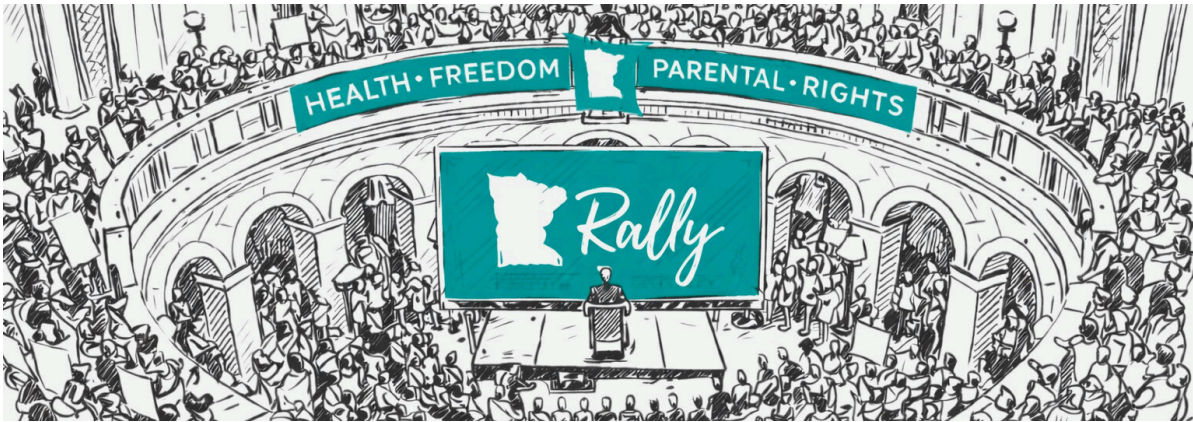


Health & Parental Rights in Minnesota



Welcome Back! Community Update:

As the new legislative session begins, families across the state are reaching out with real stories of struggle.

Parents are seeking guidance as they navigate barriers in health care, education, and child services, hoping for clarity, lawful process, and respect for their role as their children's primary advocates.

Families face mounting challenges: lost daycare access following omnibus bill changes, policies that block them from participating in their children's healthcare or accessing their records, and growing uncertainty around exemptions and homeschool protections.

Meanwhile, children with disabilities and their families struggle to access timely, appropriate services, with fraud investigations complicating delivery. These are not abstract issues- they affect Minnesota children's safety, learning, and wellbeing every single day.

Included here are current bills that enjoy strong family support, as well as others raising significant concern. Together, these reflect a broader pattern: Minnesota families are asking for transparency, accountability, and policies that honor their rights and responsibilities in raising and educating their children. As the session unfolds and more bills are filed, we hope you will keep these needs and values at the forefront.

Given current tensions, today's rally will be held virtually. Families will be reaching out via email and telephone, while a core group of volunteers will be available to speak with anyone interested.
